Throughout his life, he developed and experimented with new methods for growing fruit, bringing the best of what he knew from Europe to Canada, such as dwarf apple trees. He kept ties with Vineland Research Station, rallied for improvements for the industry through the Ontario Apple Commission, and was a resource for many fruit growers. He was proud to support his community and took his turn as President of the Rotary Club and Fire Chief of the volunteer fire department. John was a social butterfly. In recent years, his winters at Sanlan Park in Lakeland, Florida, with all the friends, golfing and grapefruit, were most dear to him. He loved being with his friends at home, playing cards and on the golf course.
