

Mrs. Eliza Jackson Died in Chesaning, Mich.

29, 1901, of Pneumonia—Remains

Taken to Arkona, Canada.

Died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Wm. Hotaling, of Chesaning, Mich., Mrs. Eliza Maidwell-Jackson, of Arkona, Canada, April 29, 1901, of pneumonia, after an illness of only a few days. Thus she joins her husband in the better land after a separation of only two months and nine days.

Eliza Maidwell was born in Easton, England, Oct. 25, 1825. In 1852 she came to America. Her future husband John W. Jackson came on the same vessel. Shortly after their arrival they were married and settled at Hamilton, Ontario; subsequently they lived in Delaware, Ont., and finally removed to Arkona, where for forty years they journeyed together toward their eternal home where now they dwell together in endless joy.

Six children were born of this union five of whom are living, viz: J. W. Jackson and Mrs. Wm. Hotaling, of Chesaning; F. R. Jackson, of St. Johns; Mrs. S. D. Abell, of Brantford, and James J. Jackson, of Arkona, Ont.

Brief funeral services were conducted by Rev. W. G. Nixon April 29 at 4:30 at the house, and the funeral party left on the morning train the following day for Arkona where all that was mortal of mother was laid to rest by the side of her husband. Funeral services were held at the church there Wednesday, May 1, at 2:30, Rev. R. F. Irwin officiating. This is the third time within six months that the Jackson family has been called to mourn, and they have the sincere sympathy of a large circle of friends.
