Railwayman Is Pensioned

Alex. Gates Makes His Last C.N.R. Run

Alex. Gates, 383 Russell street, is celebrating his 65th birthday today as he starts his pension from the Canadian National Railway. He completed his last run to them, last evening at 10.40 o'clock, from Toronto to Sarnia.

Born In Ireland

Mr. Gates, who has been with the C.N.R. for 35 years as an engineer, has been associated with railways since 1899. He was born in Ireland in Count Tyrone in 1881, joining the services of the Caledonia line in Scotland when he was 18 years old, in the capacity of a fireman.

He came to Toronto in 1906 as a fireman on the Grund Trunk line, moving to Sarnia the same year when the Grand Trunk terminal at Toronto was disposed of and each train crew was sent to their

respective train run.

In 1911 the Grand Trunk changed hands in Sarnia and was now known as the C.N.R. line. Mr. Gates joined this line, but also witnessed a change, that of fireman to engineer. He has been an engineer ever since, on manifest freights, which are his regular runs, and pool freights, which are made up on his run. These runs used to do Fort Erie, Niagara Falls and Mimico.

To Passenger Run

Seven years ago he changed from freight runs to passenger runs, his particular run going from Sarnia to Toronto.

During the last wer he carried proops on his trains but this war was just routine engineering for min. He explained that during World War II it was extremely hard to pick up lost time and that every train was going practically all the time. He also added that the engines of today are quite a bit smaller than those of ten years ago.
