

**MRS. GILLIS McPHERSON**

Mrs. Sarah Norton McPherson, widow of the late Gillis McPherson, who predeceased her several years ago, died at her home in Arkona, on Sunday, April 4th, in her 85th year. 1937

Mrs. McPherson was a lifelong resident of the district. Surviving are one daughter, Mrs. Dennis Yorke, 6th line, Warwick; two sons, George at home, and Gillis in New York state; also three sisters Mrs. Frances Davidson, of Arkona; Mrs. Stephen Goomis, of Sylvan, and Mrs. Welch, of Michigan.

The funeral was held on Wednesday afternoon at her late residence in Arkona, with interment in the Arkona cemetery. Rev. Mr. Hare, former Presbyterian minister officiated, and Mrs. J. E. DEATH OF GILLIS MCPHERSON.  
One of the oldest settlers of Warwick township died on the 9th inst. in the person of Gillis McPherson, born 1832, in his 82nd year. Deceased was a native of Badenock, Scotland, and came to Ontario when a young man, bravely doing his share of the pioneer work of Warwick. He took a deep interest in township and political matters, but never took any public office. He was married to Miss Sarah Norton, who survives him, with two sons and one daughter:—Gillis, who lives near the homestead, and George and Helen at home. One sister and one brother also survives him:—Mrs. Ann Monroe of Bosanquet, and Wm. McPherson of Warwick. The funeral took place Wednesday afternoon of last week to the Arkona cemetery, Rev. A. W. Hare, officiating, assisted by Rev. H. J. Fair. The bearers were six nephews of deceased:—Wm. J., Robt., John, Thomas and Charles McPherson, and Wm. Monroe.
