

WILLIAM HUFF DIES AT HOME IN THEDFORD

THEDFORD, Jan. 29 — William Huff, former C.N.R. yardmaster and later farmer, died yesterday at his home on Main street, Thedford, following two weeks' illness. He was in his 61st year.

Mr. Huff was employed by the Grand Trunk Railway at Palmerston 44 years ago and while there was married to Miss Margaret Wilson third daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Wilson, of that town. Then for five years he was with the G.T.R. as yardmaster at Stratford. He was transferred to Moose Jaw, Sask., and after five years as yardmaster there, homesteaded. Later he returned to Ontario and after a short time in London, farmed for 10 years in the Arkona district. Seven years ago he came to Thedford and was operator of an egg grading business here until forced to retire through ill-health two years ago. Surviving are his wife and one son, Delmo, at home; two sisters, Mrs. William Normandy, of Port Lambton, and a sister in Australia.

The funeral will be held from St. Paul's Anglican Church, Thedford, on Thursday at 2 p.m. The service will be conducted by Rev. Charles H. James. Interment will be in Arkona Cemetery.
