KENNETH TOPPING BURIED.

The funeral of Kenneth Topping took place to the beautiful cemetery at Arkona. An unusually large cortège showed the high esteem in which he was held. Flower-bearers were eight of his former schoolmates: Walter Grogan, Wluston Callahan, Lois McKehzie, Dorothy Murray, Katie Muma, Ruby Patterson, Olive Wilson and Ruby Grogan.

The pallbearers were also schoolmates: Gordon Grogan, Lawrence Gilbert, Arthur Murray, Grant Hendrick, Summers Muma, and Orville Hodgson.

The funeral services were conducted by Rev. J. Hannahson of West Adelaide Presbyterian Church, assisted by Rev. G. Allen of Arkona Presbyterian Church. Mrs. Gladys Topping Cornell of London sang two beautiful solos. "Nearer My God to Thee" was sung by W. H. McLelish.

Relatives and friends were present from Yale, Crosswell, Flint, Sarnia, Pt. Edward, Oil City, Watford, London, Strathroy and Allsa Craig. There were numerous floral tributes.

Kenneth Topping was the youngest son of Mr. and Mrs. Ambrose Topping of the 4th line, Adelaide, and was well known. He took several honor certificates at the school fairs. He won trophies at the county plowing matches, and was within half a point of the highest marks made on the grounds in 1930. Kenneth showed a great interest in the school garden, winning first prize on his plots for 1930 and 1931. As a scholar at the Strathroy Collegiate Institute, he was very popular with his schoolmates and teachers. He took an honorable place in his studies, and was unusually good in the Cadets. Being an extremely fine shot, he won second place in the class.
