MRS. ANGUS MCINTOSH

Mrs. Angus McIntosh, who was 97 years of age, died at the home of her son, Laurence McIntosh, 21st Concession, West Williams, on Wednesday, March 18. Mrs. McIntosh's maiden name was Sarah Lovell, the second oldest of a large family of six sisters and five brothers. She was born near Wroxeter in Huron County, where she learned the art of dressmaking and tailoring. Later, in 1870, she went West to keep house for her brother George, then pioneering on the prairie.

In 1885 she married Angus McIntosh of West Williams and returned West where they homesteaded on the banks of the Saskatchewan River and kept a trading store for the Indians. Mr. McIntosh was well acquainted with the territory where the Louis Riel Rebellion took place and knew many of the leaders.

In 1895 they returned to Ontario, settling on the banks of the Aux Sable River in West Williams.

Mr. McIntosh predeceased her in 1939, and her only daughter, Katherine, Mrs. J. M. Dolson, Home Demonstrator for Peel County, died in 1937.

She is survived by her son, Laurence, of 21st Concession, West Williams; one sister, Mrs. Jean McKercher, of Wingham; ten grandchildren and five great grandchildren.

Funeral services were conducted by Rev. Clarke of Arkona from the M. Box and Son funeral home, Parkhill, on Saturday, March 20th. Pallbearers were Messrs. Frank McLellan, Lloyd McLellan, David McLarty, Robert McKellar, Alex Watson and Robert Fraser. Burial was in Arkona Cemetery.
