

## THOMAS MARSH

MARSH—In West Williams on Tuesday, Feb. 14, 1928, Mr. Thomas Marsh in his 76th year.

The death of Thomas Marsh widely known and respected citizen of West Williams occurred very suddenly at his home on Tuesday, Feb. 14th. Mr. Marsh was in good health, and just the day previous was engaged in carpentry work about the home. His death came as a distinct shock to his many relatives and friends. For many years M. r Marsh associated with his brothers and later with his sons, has conducted a grist mill and farm at Hungry Hollow, the old, historic milling centre on the Aux Sauble.

Thirty-four years ago he married Sarah Fuller, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. George Fuller, of Arkona. He is survived by his wife, five sons and two daughters. The sons are: George of Arkona; Willbur, of Sarnia; Herbert, of West Williams; Milton at home; and Sherman of Strathroy. The daughters are Myrtle and Winnifrid, at home. Five brothers and one sister also survive: Joseph of Embro; James of St. Thomas, William of London; Richard of Dorchester; John of Arkona and Mrs. Samuel Webb of St. Thomas. The funeral was held in the Arkona cemetery, on Friday afternoon of last week, with a large attendance. Mr. Harold Harper of New York conducted the service. The bearers were Hugh Johnson, John Vidd, Stuart Burnham, William Marsh, George Fitzsimmons and Oliver Holmes.
