

Young Watford Mother Killed in Plympton Crash at Intersection

Mrs. Ross Wilcocks, 22, formerly Anna May Douglas, of Watford, died before reaching hospital after a car crash in Plympton twp. southeast of Camlachie on Monday.

With her two children, Diana May, 3, and Patricia, one year, she was riding in the car driven by her husband westbound on the old Egremont Road, when it collided at the intersection of Aberarder sideroad, with a two ton van of McCormick's Limited, driven southbound by Clifford Simpson, 41, of London.

The intersection is reported to have been the scene of several accidents.

The Wilcocks car was hit broadside and almost demolished; the children and their father were released from hospital on Tuesday.

Mrs. Wilcocks, prior to her marriage, resided with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. David Douglas, in Warwick twp. and in Watford. The parents now reside at Bright's Grove.

Also surviving are five brothers, Harold, Gerald, Ronald and Keith all of Sarnia, Edward of Corunna; and three sisters, Mrs. William Pasquan [Mary] of Sarnia, Mrs. Ronald Baxter [Ora] of Arkona, and Velma Douglas, Bright's Grove.

The body rested at Harper Funeral Home, where service was conducted this Thursday afternoon by Rev. E.B. Toffelmire, of St. Andrew's church, with interment in Arkona cemetery.
